# (a) Sargeant Jeremy Landry

Sargeant Landry was present to provide the quarterly statistics for calls during the past three months.

- -the DARE Program was delivered to Grade 6 students

# (a) Whitetail Crossing – Weed/Grass Control

Jaime Burghardt expressed concern about lot maintenance at Whitetail Crossing

- -a plan of action should be come up next year so the weeds don't get out of control and lots are maintained in a timely manner.
- -a number of lots have a lot of rocks in them and the weeds are not being cut around the rocks
- -residents should have their properties landscaped within a few years of a house being built
- -the town will get a contractor to do the work next year with the owners paying the cost

#### (b) Development of Greenhouse

A letter was received regarding the development of the Greenhouse.

Discussion took place

- -a request for cancellation of taxes during permitting, renovations and establishment of their crop was requested.
- -they are anticipating it will take 11/2 to 2 years to get the business up and running
- -the commercial tax incentive policy states that the renovations have to be at least \$100,000 to qualify.
- -the municipal taxes for 2014 were \$ 981.62

<u>Talaga</u> that the Town of Mundare deny the request for cancellation of taxes during, permitting and renovations at the greenhouse.

#### (c) Development Proposal – 5012 – 50 Avenue

A development proposal was received for a storage shop at 5012 – 50 Avenue.

- -the storage shop would be 80 X 50 and be one storey high
- -a wood shop would also be a future addition
- -if approved, they would like to gravel and fence the yard this year and use it for storage over winter.

#### (d) Development Proposal – 5111 – 50 Street

A development proposal was received for a building on 5111 – 50 Street.

- -the building would be a 80 X 30 two storey building
- -the building is to be used as an administration/sales office for greenhouse energy systems
- -the top storey would be used as residential
