#### **INFRASTRUCTURE**

As Council works toward finalizing the 2019 budget we are faced with a growing list of infrastructure issues that require attention sooner than later. We would like to thank all of you that attended our public meetings to share their opinions and ideas as well as those of you that have taken the time to stop into the office or reach out to us individually.

Our Councils, past and present, have always strived to manage our finances and create budgets with an eye to keeping our taxes as low as possible. One consequence of our strategy is that our Reserve funding for infrastructure hasn't kept up with the ever-increasing cost of replacement. We have been fortunate in the past to receive generous funding from our Provincial and Federal partners via a number of grant programs and have relied on that funding to maintain our infrastructure. Today however, we are faced with the fact that we need to do more than just maintain what we have as some critical infrastructure is reaching the end of its life and needs to be substantially overhauled or replaced.

## The three most pressing concerns are;

The north side sewage lift station

Relining or replacement of sewer lines

Repair of roads in the north of town and application of a second lift of asphalt in the Whitetail area.

It is anticipated that the cost of these projects could be as much as Three Million Dollars. Council and Administration are currently exploring all funding options including Grant Funding, Financing and a combination of the two. We are also working to determine the most equitable method of sharing these costs among the ratepayers that are affected by these improvements.

As we develop a more complete plan we will be consulting with all our residents to gather your feedback in the hope of creating a final plan that is in line with the expectations of our community and the responsibilities that we are sworn to as a Council under law.


