(e) Assessment Changes

The Alberta Government has initiated a review of assessment regulations for wells and pipelines.

Through the resulting changes, rural property assessment reductions would result in urban municipalities becoming responsible for a greater share of provincial education property taxes and policing costs as a result of changes in the equalized assessment. This would also have an effect on the Housing foundation requisition as it is based on the equalized assessment.

The province is asking for feedback on the changes by the end of August.

<u>Caliniou</u>: that a letter be sent to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and our MLA expressing opposition to the proposed changes in assessment regulations.

Some issues have arisen with regards to 5012-50 Avenue.
