## Finance (a) 50<sup>th</sup> Avenue Utilities Extension

The costs of the 50<sup>th</sup> Avenue utility extension came in higher than extimated. Nikaforuk Construction provided the lowest quote for \$41,610. With other costs it is estimated that the final cost for the project will be \$50,000.

The MSP grant application for \$30,000 for the project was approved. Any amount over the \$30,000 is to be covered by the current budget.
