News Release-COVID

The Town has become aware that there are positive cases of COVID 19 in our community.

We encourage all residents to follow Alberta Health Services and Health Canada Recommended Guidelines to minimize the spread of the virus. Practice good hygiene, maintain physical distancing, limit the number of people you come into close contact with and wear masks. https://www.alberta.ca/prevent-the-spread.aspx

Close contacts are defined as anyone that had contact with a case for more than 15 minutes and within two metres or the length of one hockey stick. People are considered close contacts even if they were wearing a mask. OR:

- · Has had direct contact with bodily fluids of a person who has COVID-19 (e.g., was coughed or sneezed on).
- Provides direct care for a person who has COVID-19;

Beginning on November 3, 2020 the Mundare Municipal Public Library will be open to the public on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00am to 4:00 pm.

Pick-up will continue: Patrons with items for pick up will be notified by telephone. Items will be left on the table, at the entrance to the Town of Mundare building, for zero contact pick-up. Pick-ups are available Monday to Friday, during the Town of Mundare office hours.

Van Run items will arrive on Thursdays and will be quarantined and available on Tuesdays.

Books can be dropped off in the Book Return bin located near the library entrance at the back of the town office building. Returned items will be quarantined

for 72 hours, checked in, and put back on the shelves or in the van run.
