## LIBRARY NEWS


#### During January the Mundare Municipal Public Library will be CLOSED to the public.

Staff will be on site on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. (except for January 12th when staff will not be available).

While the library manager will be onsite, patrons must REMAIN OUTSIDE THE LIBRARY as the door will be locked. Premier Kenney has announced, that as of Sunday December 13th at 12:01 a.m. all public libraries must close to the public. There will be no in-person library service until at least mid January. And perhaps beyond.

With the approval of the Mundare Library Board, the library will keep the **curbside delivery in place.** 

**Curbside pickup items** will be left on the table at the entrance to the Town of Mundare building. Pickups are available Monday to Friday during office hours for the Town of Mundare. Patrons with items for pick up will be notified by telephone. Please note that there will be no van run until January 14th.



**Books can be dropped off in the Book Return** bin located near the library entrance (at the back of the town office building). Returned items will continue to be quarantined for 72 hours, checked in, and put back on the shelves or in the van run.

Patrons wishing to renew their library cards / obtain a library card or need help with renewing a book or selecting an item for curbside pickup can contact the library manager:
