LIBRARY NEWS

MUNDARE LIBRARY IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC!!

As of June 10, 2021 Alberta has entered Stage 2 of re-opening saying that:

- libraries can open to the public at 1/3rd of the fire code occupancy (for Mundare Library this means one to two patrons)
- Masking rules remain in place (Masks are available in the library.
- Social distancing rules remain in place
- Gloves still are required for handling books on the shelves.

Staff will be on site on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00am to 4:00 pm.

Computer use:

Patrons in need of a computer may use one of the public computers for a set amount of time. Computers will be sanitized between users, and in keeping with social distancing, only one of the computers is available for use at any one time.

As always, when visiting Mundare Public Library, children aged 12 and younger must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

Curbside pickup, during the hours of opening for the Town of Mundare building, will continue. Books and other items can be dropped off in the Book Return near the library door. Memberships can be renewed or purchased during hours of operation of the library. Cash only please.
