A LITTLE HISTORY



The family of the late J.D. McAllister visited Mundare and the Basilian Fathers Museum on August 26, 2021. McAllister opened a blacksmith shop, post office and general store on the pioneer trail from Edmonton. The store was located on the northeast shore of Beaverhill Lake, 8 miles south of Mundare. When the railway placed a siding, in 1905, he moved his store to the current town site. In 1905, J. D. McAllister started one of the first general stores in Mundare. Later he opened a livery barn, lumberyard and implement shop. The family operated the store until the 1940's. Scottish Canadian merchants like, J.D. McAllister, learned to communicate with their Slavic customers in their own language and becoming quite proficient in Ukrainian.
