License are\$5.00 each.


Taxes

Happy New Year and Best Wishes for 2022 from the Mundare Municipal Library Board and Library Manager! Library Hours:

Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Library will continue to be open to the public on these days.

Curbside Pickup: Table top pickup of items ordered using TRAC or the library website is available Monday to Friday during the Town of Mundare Office hours.

Capacity and operating restrictions as outlined on the Government of Alberta Website:

Library capacity is restricted to 2 individuals plus the Library Manager (1/3 fire code occupancy) Attendees must be with household members only, or 2 close contacts if living alone. Masks and 2 metre physical distancing is required.

As always, the library manager is on hand to help patrons order items from TRAC and/or the Mundare library, or website and to renew library cards. Items can be returned using the book return near the library door.

Memberships are available: \$10 adult, \$7 senior, \$25 family,

and \$5 children.
